8. Teacher Update

- On October 11th, St. Andre Bessette hosted the Junior Volleyball Tournament.
- On October 20th, our Multilingual (MLL) and SERC students went to Chudleigh's Farm
- On Halloween, students in Kindergarten to Grade 6 participated in a dance with our very own DJ Mr. Cioffi. The students had a great time!
- The YFL sold Halloween cookies for Sharelife. They raised a total of approx. \$400
- YFL students made riddles for the morning announcements, and we had a candy corn guessing jar.
- YFL also took Kinder to ¾ teachers sign up for Halloween art. Students picked the activities and went into classes to help the teachers with the task. They also read stories to classes.
- On November 29th, Barbarinde Williams from Drums et al. will visit our school to deliver drumming workshops to our students. Mr. Williams's anti-bullying presentation titled "All Different All Equal" addresses bullying on all levels in Ontario schools. This is an empathy-based assembly that assists in character building.
- For All Souls Day, a binder was placed on the altar in the front foyer for people to write the name of a loved one.
- On November 11th, classes participated in a Remembrance Day Liturgy led by Ms. Iafrate and Ms. Costantino's classes.

- Students in grade 4, completed the CCAT this week, a test used to measure verbal, nonverbal and quantitative reasoning.
- The YFL will be launching an "Anti-Bullying" week starting Monday. Students will partake in a Spirit Week with activities centred around stopping bullying and bringing awareness.
- Snack Shack is back in full force every Friday.
- All grade 8 students were invited to St. Thomas Aquinas on November 2nd for the Grade 8 Outreach Day!
- On November 1st, we had The Dairy Farmers present educational sessions to our intermediate students.
- The intermediate boys and girls Volleyball family of school tournament will be held on Wednesday, November 26th, at St. Lourds.
- There will be a Chess Invitational Tournament on November 30th. The team will consist of 6 junior and intermediate students.
- In our Cross Country board meet, E.T, in grade 5, placed 1st, meaning he's the fastest grade 5 boy in our board. Thank you to Mr. Oniell for placing an order to have a banner made for him. Banners are only made for teams, not individual runners.
- Thank you to Riverstone Community Center for hosting the grade 8 retreat on Friday, November 10th.
- Dec 1st Holy Name High School is hosting a coding day for all Grade 8 female students. All 29 students will be attending.

9. Principal Update

- Grade 7/8 had a vaccine clinic
- Intermediate boys basketball being held at lunchtime
- Advent Mass Dec. 12 at 9:30 led by Father Abraham
 - o Father Abraham will be coming in for confession starting with grade 8's and working way down
- Earth Rangers will be here Dec. 20 for K-8's, animal presentation in gym
- Movie Day Dec. 21 for Grades 1-8
 - o Snacks kids can bring only what snacks they can fit in pockets, no backpacks permitted
 - o Younger kids watching Wish, older kids watching Wonka
- Craft night next week
 - o Cookies ordered already (450) snowman sugar cookies
 - o Bottled chocolate milk from Costco (shelf stable)
 - \$10.99 for 16 68 cents/bottle
 - 450 bottles = 29 cases
- Staff members being sent for CPI training
 - o Teaching staff to deal with children in crisis
 - Crisis prevention/intervention
 - How to safely restrain child until they calm down
 - One person restraint on younger, 2 person on older as last resort
 - Verbal de-escalation in violent situation

10. Update of Council Priorities/Actions for 2023/2024

- a. Christmas event and milk & cookies update
 - \$5/family for Santa picture money raised for Helping Hands, gift cards for families in need
 - Tables and chairs set up in gym, YouTube karaoke/caroling
 - Selfie wall
- b. Hot lunch update
 - Portuguese chicken: not a huge amount of orders so far; will give until end of January to see
 - Possible second pizza day instead
 - Parents would have to help
 - Beef patties have as a one-off treat instead of weekly
 - o Run like snack shack, students go to pick it up instead of parents going room to room
 - Shawarma chicken, gyro, falafel
 - \$5.99 for 6 inch (regular price \$8.99)
 - Toppings need to be standardized (set choices like sub lunches)
 - Request sample for parent council meeting
- c. Spring Fundraising
 - Big box of cards
 - Can run after March break
 - o Dieleman's lower price point for more cards
 - Vote to run Dieleman's card fundraiser in March unanimous yes
 - Little Caesars pizza kits
 - o \$6 profit per kit
 - o Frozen, has be distributed that day can book pickup night on parent council meeting night
 - Online ordering
 - Second pizza day

- o Can potentially raise approx. \$10,000 a year
- Parent volunteers to organize someone to count money, someone to place order
- Students already volunteer for Tuesday pizza day, can help for both
- Need to confirm that Gino's can take on another day
- d. Classroom Games
 - T. Dell'Erario sent google form to staff re. bins and games needed
 - Only a few teachers still had bins
 - o All needed new games
 - o Would like to buy themselves and submit receipts
 - 21 teachers/classes
 - o As of now, not enough money in council account to cover
 - o School can pay for it now, council can reimburse after fundraising
 - Parents and teachers agree this is a need for the whole school
 - Council to buy bins, teachers to buy games
- e. School Jerseys and Spirit Wear Update
 - Spirit wear online store, link sent to parents. Samples will be at school for size reference
 - Jerseys pricing out still
 - o May only buy one set this year, another set next year
 - o 15 per set \$50 each
- f. Movie night
 - Not proceeding
