- Campaign process
 - Choose product, send out opt-out letters to families explaining fundraiser
 - o Send home 1 case per family
 - o Discourage kids selling door to door
 - o Families pay school cash online
 - o Once payment received, can take second case if needed
 - o Prizes create draw tickets, company provides 2 gnomes for every 100 cases, draw names each day
 - o Run campaign for 2 weeks students have 2 full weeks (3 weekends) to sell
 - o Any cases received that are not opened can be refunded for full credit
 - o For every 100 cases bought, company provides 4 free cases (worth \$400) can put this extra profit towards grand prizes

8. Teacher Report – T. Dell'Erario & L. Mazzucco

- On Oct 9th, the Grade 8s attended a Wellness Retreat at Riverstone Community Centre. Students participated in movement, collaborative games, and meditation.
- On October 10th, some of the Junior grades went to watch "Wild Robot" to support the novel study they are doing in class. The students had a great time!
- On Oct.16th, students had a Cross Country Family meet. Four students qualified to compete at the Board Tournament. On Oct. 22, at the Board Cross Country Meet Isaiah in grade 5 placed 2nd overall.
- On the 16th and the 18th, The Indigenous Education Team came to our school and students in grades 4-8 participated in a workshop with a giant map that focussed on Indigenous language, traditional territory, treaties, communities and more.
- On Oct. 17th and 18th, the Junior boys and girls participated in a Family Volleyball tournament at St. John Bosco. The students played with great sportsmanship at both tournaments.
- On Oct. 21, CCAT testing for the grade 4s began
- The week of Oct. 28th we had Spirit Week. Students participated in hat day, Orange and Black day, a Halloween costume and dance day, ending off the week with a PJ/Cozy day and a movie.
- YFl visited K- 2 classes to do a Hallowen craft with them, they had a Trivia day and a Scavenger hunt. Ms. Chiodo and Ms. Luciani's class won a prize.

- Halloween cookies were sold, All proceeds went to Sharelife.
- During the month of October the Wellness Leaders participated in whole school announcements around our wellness. This month they are partnering with the Eco schools to create recycling and earth posters. The group is working towards creating a safe space for grades 6-8 to take a break and support their mental health.
- The Eco team continues with their litterless lunch Thursdays initiative. The Eco team is conducting audits on classes who signed up to be audited. This is where they count how many litterless lunches are brought to school in each classroom.
- Tomorrow we will be having the Region of Peel presenting waste and education workshops to Grades 1 to 3. This is to put the spotlight on current waste issues and to try and inspire students to reduce waste at home and school. The grade 1 focus is the importance of the 3Rs (Reduce, Reuse and Recycle). The grade 2 workshop will focus on sustainability in our relationship with the natural environment. Grade 3s will focus on the food lifecycle by looking at properly disposing of food waste, and uncover composting methods in the Region of Peel. They will also investigate different stages of decomposition.
- There is an extended day trip for grade 7s and 8s is still in the works. Info and location will be released once details are finalized
- On Nov. 12, grade 8s will be going to St. Thomas Aquinas for a Day in the Life
- The third week of November, we will be having Bully Prevention and Awareness Week. The YFL will be leading a liturgy virtually.
